IMPULSE POINT DONATES EXHIBIT LANDSCAPING TO DALLAS AREA HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Dallas, TX, November 1, 2005 – Impulse Point recently donated more than \$2,000 worth of landscaping plants to the Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity organization. The plants, including palm trees, birds of paradise, bromeliads, and ferns, will be available through the Habitat's Home Improvement Outlet store in Dallas, Texas.

Through community donations, the Dallas Habitat Home Improvement Outlet (www.dallas-habitat.org) sells quality, low-cost materials that help support building new homes. The Outlet Stores accept overstocked items, seconds, used, discontinued and salvageable building materials, home improvement items, and major appliances donated by builders, contractors, manufacturers and individuals. Donated materials are used whenever possible in the construction of Dallas Area Habitat homes. The remainder are sold at discounted prices and the profits help finance construction efforts for Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity.

"One of Impulse's core values is to be environmentally friendly whether we are in a university network environment or the community at large," said David Robinson, CEO of Impulse Point. "Every aspect of our low-tech, environmentally friendly, renewable tradeshow booth was designed with this corporate value in mind from the native Florida palms that we gave away to attendees to the palms and plants used in the design of the exhibit that were donated to the Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity."

The plants were used as part of Impulse Point's island themed exhibit at the recent EDUCAUSE 2005 conference in Orlando and the League for Innovation Conference on Information Technology in Dallas.
